**Guidance and Counseling Cell:**

The Guidance and Counseling Cell of the college is headed by Prof.Nalini Chandar, Head of the Department of English who also has a Master's Degree in Counseling and Psychotherapy. She is ably assisted by Prof.Pushpa, Head of the Department of Economics.

Teenage and adolescent issues that require a sensitive approach are taken up by the cell on a regular basis.

Counseling on matters related to 'Personal Adjustment', unreasonable fears and expectations and compulsive obsessions are given due attention.

Through SWOT analysis the counselees are made to realize their own strengths and limitations and the outcome of diffident, pessimistic attitudes as well as inferiority complex.

Students are guided to make use of certain adjunctive resources to reduce stress. Simultaneously physical, social and environmental causes of stress are looked into as in many cases stress is due to either one or all of these factors.

As anxiety and depression are acute states of stress, strategies are taught to overcome the same. Strategies such as attacking the problem, compromising with it; using defense mechanisms are taught to students who come for counseling.

### **Guidance and Counseling Cell:**

The Guidance and Counselling Cell of the college is headed by Prof.Nalini Chandar, Head of the Department of English who also has a Master's Degree in Counselling and Psychotherapy. She is ably assisted by Prof.Pushpa, Head of the Department of Economics.

The Counseling Cell has been striving to teach students to handle stress at different levels. The sources of stress could be –

- a) **Biological** – arising from low energy levels, sickness, poor diet, lack of sleep and fatigue.
- b) **Psychological**-arising from frustration, personal limitations, loss of loved ones, loss of prestige and lack of meaning in life. It can be a result of a conflict arising from two incompatible needs such as honesty and personal gain.
- c) **Sociological**-stemming from family background, poor parentage, low economic status or social bias.
- d) **Environmental** causes of stress are equally important too as the neighbourhood, peer group, friends circle can either make or mar a person.

Steps are evolved to resolve the above mentioned 'Stressors' by

defining the problem, working out alternative solutions, improving inter-personal relationships, changing faculty assumptions about people and self.

Effective coping strategies like turning threats into challenges, changing goals to suit individual needs, changing attitudes are adopted with success.

Very importantly Non-Directive and Co-Operative methods of Counseling are used which has helped several students to ascertain their personality.
